Good Morning. Welcome to anyone who is visiting with us this morning. If this is your first time at Holy Trinity, please introduce yourself to our Greeters and Clergy. We do ask that you sign our guest book in the foyer.

Remembrance Sunday. Today is a time to reflect on those who gave their lives in the fight for freedom and peace during war time. It is a time to pray for the men and women who have served and are currently serving our county, and pray for lasting peace in our world.

Altar Flowers. The flowers are given in memory of those who fought for our freedom and all members who are serving in the Military Services today.

Baptism Today. Through baptism, we welcome into the Church and into the family of God *Harrison Clarke*, son of Sammy Clarke & Brendalee Phillips.

Ring of Bells (Bells of Peace). Bells call us to wake, to pray, to work, to arms, to feast and, in times of crisis, to come together. On November 11, 1918, the ringing of church bells erupted spontaneously across the country, as an outpouring of relief that four years of war had come to an end. This evening at 5 p.m. the bell(s) will be tolled 100 times with 5 seconds between tolls, The bells emulate that moment of remembrance in honour of our veterans who served in WWI.

Diocesan Advent Challenge for the Primate World Relief. The Bishop is challenging the parishes to raise funds to build a dispensary or two for PWR. Dispensaries have solar panels and refrigeration that enables PWR to stock medication and vaccines. Each one cost \$7,500 when matched on a 6:1 ratio by Global Affairs Government of Canada. Our \$7,500 would equal \$52,500. We will take the monies received to build as many dispensaries as possible. Extra funds will be used to stock dispensaries and provide birth kits. The Campaign will run from Sunday, November 11 – Sunday, December 23. Donations for this campaign should come to the Synod Office from the Parish.
